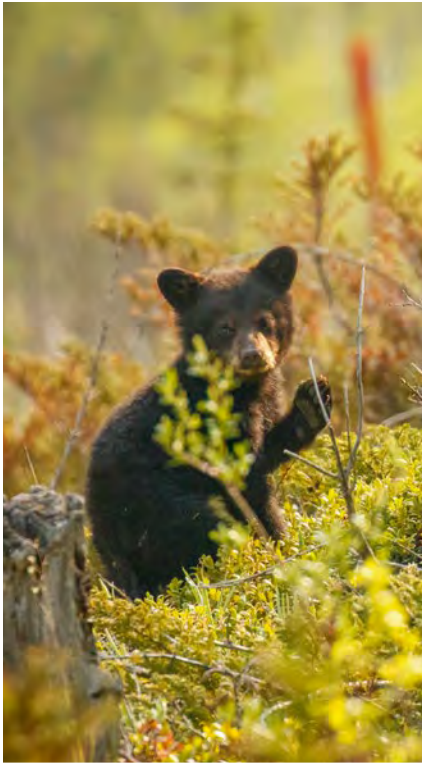




## CANADA FROM COAST TO COAST: A SNEAK PEAK

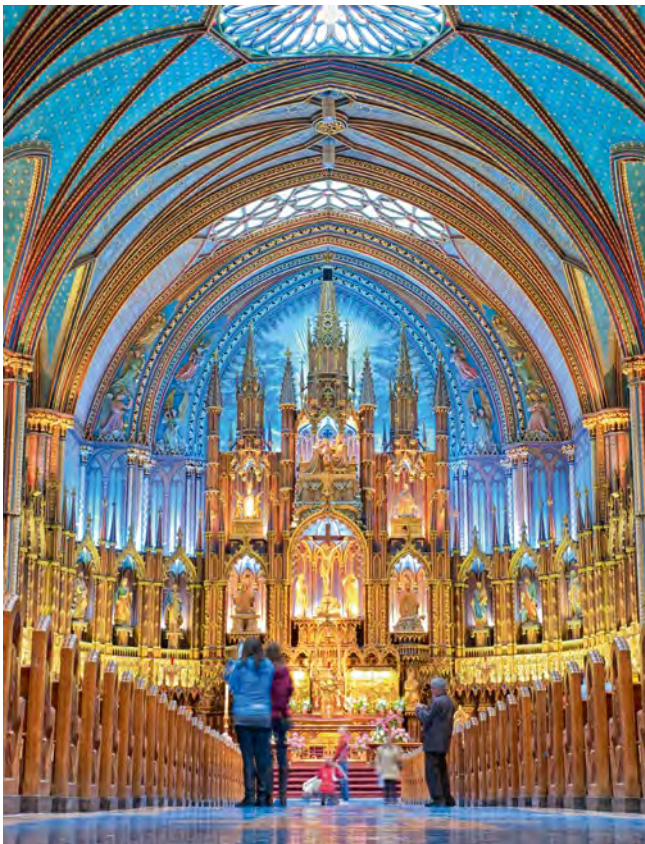

A visit to the world's most picturesque lighthouse brings guests to charming Peggy's Cove in Nova Scotia.



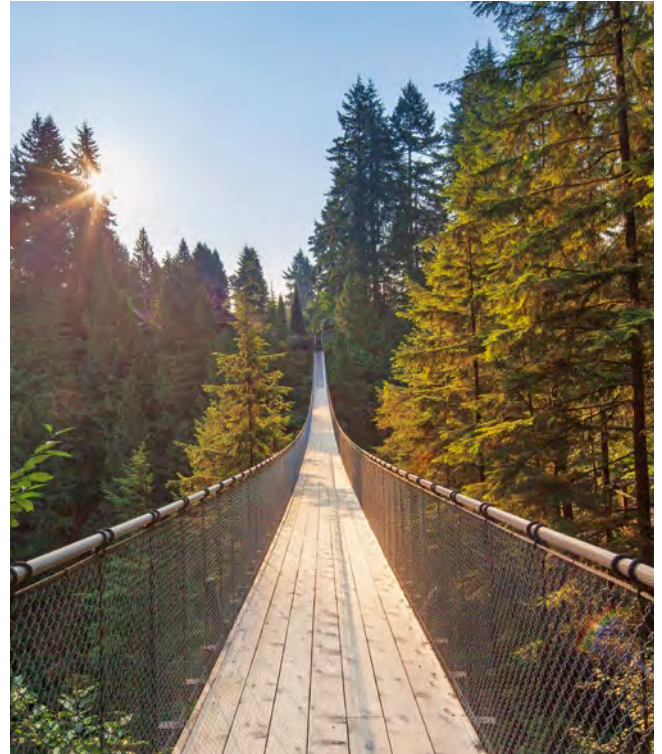
Nothing like a refreshing boat ride right into the spray of the magnificent Niagara Falls.

## THE CANADIAN: THE TRAIN • THE COMPARTMENTS

The classic streamlined stainless-steel cars of **THE CANADIAN**, the most prestigious train of Canada's railroad company, VIA Rail, stem from the golden age of North American Railroads. In the dining car, guests enjoy top-notch service and a choice of excellent meals for breakfast, lunch, and dinner, as well as delicious Canadian wines. Particularly popular: the panorama cars and the observation car at the end of the train, offering unparalleled views through its glass ceiling.

- ◆ **Cabin couchette:** Open compartment with two armchairs facing each other. At night, the seats are pushed together to form a wide bed. Sink, shower, and WC are shared facilities at the end of each car.
- ◆ **Sleeper:** Private two-bed compartment (7.2 ft x 5 ft/220 x 151 cm plus restroom 2.75 ft x 2.1 ft/84 x 64 cm) with two chairs, private WC and sink. Shared shower.

- ◆ **Single compartment:** Private compartment (6.4 ft x 3.6 ft/ 196 x 110 cm) with a comfortable seat that is converted into a bed for the night. Private WC and sink. Shared shower.
- ◆ **Prestige Sleeper Class:** Compartments with a private shower and WC. Further advantages compared to the traditional sleeping car: over 50% more space, a 60% larger picture window, and minibar service. Complimentary drinks are served in the compartment.
